As an RN in a high-volume Emergency Department, it is my responsibility to provide both urgent and critical care to patients of all ages autonomously as well as in coordination with physicians, other nurses, case management, and ancillary staff. I assist in all level one and level two traumas, support the physicians in all bedside treatment including but not limited to intubation, chest tubes, medication administrations, medication calculations, cardiac arrest care, minor surgical procedures, end of life care. I am constantly assessing my patients for improvement or deterioration and providing clinical input to keep patients safe. Completing all tasks to care for up to a 6 patient assignment load at a time, is part of my daily work. I am also a full time Charge Nurse directing all patient care and managing a staff of Nurses and Physicians in providing safe and efficient care for all patients. In addition to that I also coordinate the trauma scheduling for our ED administration.

As an RN first in the ICU and then in the ED, it was my responsibility to provide critical care to all patients based on a five level triage system, with both autonomy and with care coordination with physicians, RNs, case management, and ancillary staff. I assisted in all level one and level two traumas, supported the physicians in all bedside treatment including but not limited to intubation, chest tubes, medication administrations, medication calculations, cardiac arrest care, minor surgical procedures and constantly assessing my patients for improvement or deterioration and providing clinical input to keep the patient safe.

I worked in the Cardiology Unit, and on the ICU Float Team as a staff nurse taking care of patients after cardiac surgery and post myocardial infarction. I was responsible for cardiac rhythm interpretation, high risk medications, and IV medication calculation. I was also responsible for cardiac rehabilitation, so patient education was essential to safe discharge planning. In this role, I was required to multi- task and work autonomously to manage a 5-6 patient care assignment. I was frequently reassigned to the ICU to manage intubated and critical patients.
